Increase sisters' capacities to **strengthen the sustainability & internal systems of their congregations**.

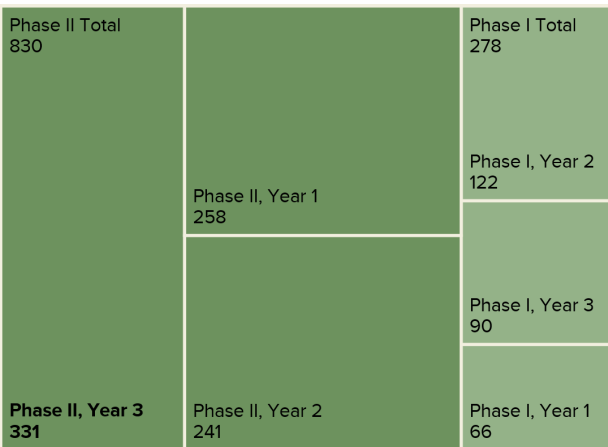


Assist HESA alumnae to use their acquired skills & knowledge to **enhance & sustain their ministries / congregations**.

A total of **1,108** sisters have been served by the HESA program. Recruitment in Phase II, Year 3 has been the largest to date.

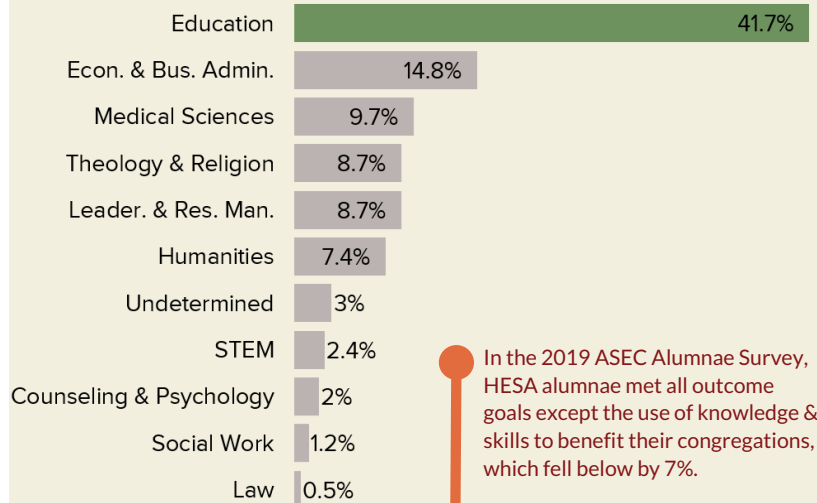
WORKSHOP SUCCESSES

Orientation Attendance Rate 99% 98% of HESA sisters reported that Orientation met or exceeded their expectations.

Reflective Learning Attendance Rate 88% 99% of HESA sisters reported that Reflective Learning content met or exceeded their expectations.

HESA Alumnae Workshop Attendance Rate 42% 97% of HESA alumnae reported that the Alumnae Workshop met or exceeded their expectations.

The field of **education** is by far the most popular amongst HESA sisters.



In the 2019 ASEC Alumnae Survey, HESA alumnae met all outcome goals except the use of knowledge & skills to benefit their congregations, which fell below by 7%.
