Increase sisters' capacities to strengthen the sustainability & internal systems of their congregations.




Assist HESA alumnae to use their acquired skills & knowledge to enhance & sustain their ministries / congregations.

WARKSHAP SUCCESSES

Orientation Attendance Rate

98% of HESA sisters reported that Orientation met or exceeded their expectations.

Reflective Learning Attendance Rate

99% of HESA sisters reported that Reflective Learning content met or exceeded their expectations.

HESA Alumnae Workshop Attendance Rate

97% of HESA alumnae reported that the Alumnae Workshop met or exceeded their expectations.
